— Pull Cable

- UTP and Optical Fiber, through conduit, closed walls and open ceilings

— Terminations

- Route and terminate UTP cable on 66, 110, BIX, Krone, 210 and Gigabix blocks to CAT 5E and CAT 6 Standards.
- Work area outlets to T568A and T568B wiring schemes (including Caddy installation in sheetrock)
- Patch Panels

- Modular Plugs
- BNC Connectors (one piece and three piece)
- F Connector (crimp and compression)
- Ground Connectors
- Testing UTP, Coax and Optical Fiber
- Test Copper UTP Cable using a VOM and basic testing with certification test set
