The positive outlooks of our program teams and graduates have us very excited for what's next as we approach the end of the year.



Celebrating Royce



Raised in Brooklyn by his father, Royce was taught to work hard, which he has been doing since the age of 15. A young father himself, **he wanted to do more for his children** but always ended up in dead-end restaurant jobs.

After losing his job during the pandemic, Royce received a letter in the mail asking if he was interested in free job training. He said he didn't know programs like BWI existed.

Not only would he get trained in the technical aspects of a new career but he would be coached and guided through the hiring process afterward.

Royce graduated from <u>Brooklyn Networks</u> last year and today, is working as a low-voltage electrician with Filo Secure. He says that when he leaves work at the end of the day, people look at him differently now. He is more confident and it shows. "My son brags all the time that his daddy's an electrician! He sees me come home with my tools and he'll put on my hardhat."

BREAKING IT DOWN

The Sunset Park Bridge Program

At the core of BWI's mission is removing barriers to employment for unemployed and underemployed New Yorkers. With this in mind, BWI and Fifth Avenue Committee launched the **Sunset Park Bridge Program** in 2018. The program focuses exclusively on enrolling New Americans in and around Sunset Park: a vibrant, working class community, known historically as a "first stop" for immigrants.

The Bridge Program is an on-ramp to BWI's Brooklyn Networks and Red Hook on the Road programs, both which require testing to receive sector-specific credentials. Through the bridge program, 129 jobseekers in need of English support have received targeted, sector-specific language instruction, along with career navigation to guide them through the training and credentialing process. We are proud of this program's success and the opportunity it creates for New Americans.
