

Celebrating DeAndra (HCP)

DeAndra's journey is a powerful testament to resilience. When the pandemic struck, she lost her job as a security guard as she began caregiving for her father. When she was ready to return to work, she had trouble finding a job but discovered an ad for the Housing Career Pathways (HCP) program. **Inspired by her own experience living in a shelter with her two children**, she was excited about a career helping New Yorkers access affordable housing.



DeAndra grew her skills during training and with the support of staff, landed a Housing Lottery Specialist role after graduation. Two years later, she advanced at her company and, with newfound financial stability, moved to a new apartment with her children. DeAndra says, "The greatest reward is being present for my children, providing them with the secure, loving environment I grew up with."

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Housing Career Pathways Celebrates 100th Graduate

BWI's customized training program, <u>Housing Career Pathways</u> (HCP) prepares jobseekers for high-quality jobs within New York City's affordable housing sector. Along with program partners <u>Enterprise Community Partners</u>, <u>NYC Housing Preservation</u> <u>and Development</u>, and <u>NYCHA</u>, BWI hosted a graduation event on Thursday, October 10th celebrating HCP's 100th graduate.

Launched in 2022, HCP trains participants through a four-week course followed by an 80-hour paid internship and supported job search, connecting graduates to roles in affordable housing lease-up or compliance. The program is designed to enroll residents of public and affordable housing who can leverage their lived experience to help other access stable places to live.
